Serving every geographic area in the state, Kentucky's 15 Children's Advocacy Centers (CACs) provide direct forensic and supportive services to children and non-offending caregivers impacted by child sexual abuse, physical abuse, and other forms of maltreatment. CACs streamline the systemic response to child abuse by offering forensic interviews, victim support, advocacy, medical evaluations, and mental health services at a single child-friendly location.

Measuring Outcomes

CAC Kentucky continually assesses the quality of services available to Kentucky's families and communities through examination of Outcome Measurement System (OMS) survey results. Responses from over 1,249 caregivers and investigative partners surveyed in 2020 demonstrate the critical role CACs play in the investigative and healing processes.

99.8% of caregivers describe CAC staff as friendly and pleasant

95.6% of community partners report CACs provide resources that enable them to better work their cases
